ABOUT QUAID-E-AZAM TROPHY 2020-21:

- 31 matches to be played on a double-league basis with each side guaranteed a minimum of 10 first-class matches. For schedule, click <u>here</u>
- The event will be played under <u>Covid-19 protocols</u> at four venues in Karachi, namely National Stadium, National Bank of Pakistan Sports Complex, State Bank Stadium and UBL Sports Complex.
- Central Punjab will defend the title they won in 2019-20 after beating Northern by an innings and 16 runs in the final at National Stadium, Karachi. Other four sides are Balochistan, Khyber Pakhtunkhwa, Sindh and Southern Punjab
- The event will take a break after three rounds and will resume from 20 November following the conclusion of the remaining four HBL Pakistan Super League 2020 matches, which were postponed on 17 March due to Covid-19 pandemic.
- The winner of the tournament will receive PKR10million while the runner-up will collect PKR5million

- *PKR500,000 will be handed out to tournament's top-performers and the player of the final will get PKR50,000*
- Players to earn PKR60,000, per match the double-league format provides a high-performing player to earn, at least, PKR600,000. This is part of the PCB's strategy and commitment to enhance earning opportunities as well as to reward high-performing cricketers. Click <u>here</u> to read more
